Mountainbikers to ride Epic to raise funds for children in need

HELDERBERG MOUNTAINBIKERS, MALAN Wykerd and Willem Coetzee, have pledged to help children in need by riding the Absa Cape Epic (an extreme 8 day 800 km Mountainbike Ride) for the Distance for Difference (D4D) charity.

They plan to use this event to raise funds for D4D (Distance for Difference), a non profit charity organization.

"Our aim is to collect more than R60 000 for the D4D campaign (all funds to be deposited directly into the account of D4D)," said Willem.

D4D is a local non profit charity organisation which uses mainly sports men and woman to generate funding through individual and group sponsorship (visit www.d4dsa.co.za for more information).

Funds generated are used to improve the lives of mainly children in the Western Cape area.

Malan and Willem, who have both cycled in numerous long distance cycle events, will be doing the Epic for the first time.

The Epic takes place every year around the last week of March and the first week of April. The route changes every year, and leads aspiring amateur and professional mountain bikers from around the world through approximately 800 kilometres of the unspoilt nature of the Western Cape and consist of approximately 16 000 m of vertical climbing over some of the most magnificent mountain ranges in South Africa.

Among the races Malan has competed include the Swazi Fronteir (180 km three day race), the Sani to Sea (250 km, three day race), the Trans Baviaans (a 230 km one day race) around 20 Cape Argus races and many other one day races.

Willem has ridden the Swazi Fronteir, the Wine to Whales (a three day 220 km ride), the Karoo to Coast (a 100 km one day event) plus many other one day races.

Stéphan Pieterse, the founder of D4D, and took part in the Total Sport Challenge last year and raised about R5 000 for the D4D campaign.

"After we had done that we decided to do something like the Epic and raise more money for D4D," said Willem.

Stéphan Pieterse explains his organisation helps mobilise runners, cyclists, walkers and swimmers to get sponsorships for every kilometre they complete during the year.

"With the money we collect, we help to make the lives of specifically children a little bit easier and make their future look a bit more promising.

"Our slogan 'Children in need is our passion in deed', sums up our vision.

"Our dream is that the children of SA can be children in stable family environments, without fear of abuse or abandonment and with prospects of becoming adults that can positively contribute to the future and well being of South Africa and its people."
